Innovation Information

The proposal requires the submission of answers to six (6) questions, including a short summary of your innovation. You will not be scored on the final two questions (questions 5 and 6). The summary will be used to confirm the innovativeness and relevance of your project in our screening process. Responses to the subsequent questions will be reviewed and scored using the scoring matrix which can be [found here](#).

There is a high character count limit in lieu of an unlimited character count for the following sections. You may add as much as you need to properly describe the Innovation. However, we ask that you take responsibility to add only the information that is needed to understand your proposed project and respond to the questions asked. We ask this to respect the reviewers' time as well as your fellow applicants. A suggested submission guideline is equivalent to a maximum of 10 pages written.

You may answer the questions in this section either directly in the provided spaces or by attaching any of the following:

- Word document (suggest 10 pages or less with 12-point font or bigger)
- PowerPoint presentation (suggest 15 slides or less with 18-point font or bigger)
- MP3 audio file (suggest 5 minutes long or less)
- Link to a YouTube video (suggest 5 minutes long or less)

If you choose to use multiple upload formats, please, clearly label each item to the corresponding question with your last name and application ID. Please refrain from using spaces, for example:

- Documents/PowerPoints: "*LastName-ApplicationID-Q1*"
- Videos (if a certain time frame is most relevant): "*LastName-ApplicantionID-Q2-1M40S-6M23S*"

Content above and beyond these suggested sizes may not be reviewed as part of the application.

Any alternate submission style must still be uploaded to Fluxx. There will be space on the application form for you to provide links to documents, audio, or videos that are available on a website (e.g., YouTube, Vimeo), so you do not have to upload them.

All applications regardless of format will be considered equally.

There is no deadline to apply. Applications will be accepted and reviewed for as long as there is funding available. Selection will take place on a quarterly to semi-annual basis, beginning in Spring 2023. To submit the proposal, applicants must follow the application instructions found at indigenouinnovate.org.

Key themes to keep in mind: *All projects should speak to how their project will directly or indirectly honour the Land and Water (environmental sustainability practices) and how they are grounded in Indigenous ways of knowing and being.*

All projects should speak to how they uphold gender equality, by creating safe spaces, removing barriers, or uplifting gender equality throughout the innovation's lifecycle.

Question 1

What is your bold idea or innovative solution? Please address how it is innovative and relevant to this funding call. [9,000-character count including spaces. Provide an attachment if more space is required]

- How does innovation impact or connect to your chosen investment priority area?

- Does your solution honour Indigenous Ways of Knowing and Being, Indigenous Laws and Rights, and the Land?
- How does it acknowledge interconnectedness, relationality, ceremony, or 7th generation thinking?
- Are women and gender-diverse voices involved in decision-making and leadership roles?
- How will your innovation address gender equality? How will your innovation address environmental sustainability?
- What is the social purpose and the intended social impact of your innovation?
- What grounds your project?
- Does it revive or implement ancestral knowledges?
- Is the idea being developed/tested/refined in close partnership with the community or communities that will be impacted by it?

Question 3

What does success for this project look like for you, your organization, and/or your community? Please include any information about the potential for this project's future sustainability or scalability. [9,000-character count including spaces]

Key points to consider:

- Brief overview of your implementation plan
- How is it sustainable? Consider leadership, continuity, lands, other resources
- What is the potential for impact, including cultural reclamation and gender equality
- Is there a clear vision for your innovation?
- Are you working in collaboration with anyone that will help you achieve success?
- How will you know if you are meeting community's needs?
- What specific results do you expect to find that will tell us if your innovation has been successful?
