Please note that applications will be assessed based on the Innovation Screen Criteria described in the Funding Opportunity (i.e., Innovation and Relevance) to determine if they will proceed to the next stage.

3. What makes your solution innovative and how is it a better option than current approaches in your target setting? [1,500 characters]
4. Describe how the health impacts of climate change have influenced the design, functioning, and deployment of your innovation. [1,500 characters]
 - Indicate whether the innovation was developed in response to a climate-driven health risk or adapted from an existing health solution. If adapted from an existing solution, describe the specific changes made to the design, functioning, and deployment of the innovation to address the climate-driven health risk.
 - Consider Nexa's focus on climate-driven health innovations that are intentionally designed to address a health-related impact of climate change. Considerations around health adaptation and resilience to climate risks should be central to the innovation's design, functionality, and deployment).
